Reduction in Parish Tax

Over the last several years the parish council has not increased the level of the parish precept. This is the share of the Council tax received by the parish for work such as street lighting, grass cutting, hedges and other general maintenance for which we have a responsibility.

This year, because we have completed major work on the playground in St. Mary's Park, and having previously updated all our old light standards and changed our street lamps to LEDs, we find we can afford to reduce this year's precept by 10% without affecting services.

Hedges

Major work on hedges in the parish is in progress.

The hedges on Kinwarton Farm Road have been cut right back to the inner edge of the pavement and their height reduced so that people do not have to duck underneath or walk in the roadway.

On Kinwarton Road, the scrubby hedges from the Fenwick Close cut-through to the Kinwarton parish sign have been completely cut back. The roots will be ground out and the debris removed. A native hedge will be planted further away from the pavement edge and the grass verge will be reinstated.

This will make it easier and safer for prams, pushchairs and wheelchairs to be used along this stretch of footpath and will reduce future maintenance costs.

Unfortunately, the dispute between ourselves, the County Council and Redrow over ownership of hedges on the Pastures continues.



We would like to remind households that it is their responsibility to ensure that their own hedges are kept trimmed so that they do not encroach onto the footpaths or highways.
